8	MS. REILLY: John Adler?

20	MS. REILLY: We do have a quorum.
21	The next item is an update on TRS
22	operations. Each of you received a
23	calendar of events; and a few updates from
24	Ellen.
25	MS. DILEO: On December 30, 2015, TRS

filed its June 30, 2015 comprehensive 1 2 annual financial statement with the Government Finance Officers' Association. 3 4 Preparations are underway to send out the fourth quarter 2015 statements. 5 The quarterly account statements for 6 members currently in service or on leave 7 8 is expected to begin mailing the week of February 8, to an estimated population of 9 119,500 members. Approximately 12,200 10 members have elected to view their 11 12 statements online only. Online posting of the TDA quarterly 13 14 statements for participants with TDA deferred status is expected to begin next 15 16 week, concurrently with statements being 17 printed. The estimated population is 52,000. Approximately 47,000 will be 18 printed and mailed, with an additional 19 20 4,000 members having elected to view their 21 statements online only. Mailing of the TDA quarterly statements 22 23 for beneficiary participants to an estimated population of 891 members is 24 expected to occur on January 22. 25

1	TRS is excited to announce that our
2	redesigned website will go live on the
3	morning of Monday, January 25. Our
4	address will be the same, www.trsnync.org,
5	and members will be allowed to log in
б	using their current user name and
7	password.
8	Members will find a more open page
9	design, less crowded content and improved
10	navigation. And the new website is mobile
11	friendly, great news for those using a
12	smartphone or tablet.
13	MS. REILLY: Thank you, Ellen.
14	Next on the agenda is a report by the
15	Actuary.
16	MS. CHAN: Thank you. On a memo dated
17	December 3, 2015, my office had sent out a
18	memo regarding the updated preliminary
19	2016 appropriation. The updated amounts
20	are \$3.7 billion, approximately. That's
21	\$295 million more than the preliminary
22	2016 appropriation.
23	The majority of that was due to the
24	mortality change we had discussed in
25	December; and the remaining amount is due

1	to a data issue that my office found
2	concerning the CUNY members.
3	So, I'll be happy to answer any
4	questions you guys might have.
5	MS. VICKERS: Can you repeat the
б	increase?
7	MS. CHAN: It's \$295 million.
8	CHAIRPERSON ADLER: I have a
9	question. Was any of the increase in the
10	mortality table mitigated? You were
11	looking to find
12	MS. CHAN: We did have some
13	mitigation measures in there, but it did
14	not affect Teachers, it affected BERS.
15	CHAIRPERSON ADLER: Thank you.
16	Any other questions for Sherry?
17	(No response.)
18	MS. REILLY: Thank you.
19	So, the next item on the agenda is the
