4 MS. REILLY: Good afternoon.
5 Welcome to the board meeting of the
6 Teachers' Retirement System for February
7 9, 2023.
8 I'll start by calling the roll.
9 Bryan Berge?
10 MR. BERGE: Representing Mayor Eric
11 Adams, present.
12 MS. REILLY: Thomas Brown?
13 CHAIRPERSON BROWN: Here.
14 MS. REILLY: Anthony Giordano?
15 (No response.)
16 Alison Hirsh?
17 MS. HIRSH: Present, representing
18 Comptroller Brad Lander.
19 MS. REILLY: David Kazansky?
20 MR. KAZANSKY: Present.
21 MS. REILLY: Victoria Lee?
22 MS. LEE: Present.
23 MS. REILLY: We have a quorum.
24 Next on the agenda is an update on
25 TRS operations. And Kavita Kanwar will

2 MS. KANWAR: Good afternoon.
3 Members will be notified that their
4 account statements for the fourth quarter
5 of 2022 are now available.
6 On February 8, 2022 the quarterly
7 account statements were posted on our
8 website for approximately 120,000 members
9 who are currently in service or on leave.
10 On January 31 the TD quarterly
11 statements were posted online for
12 approximately 63,000 members who have TD
13 deferral accounts. And on 26 January the
14 TD quarterly statements for the TD
15 (unclear) were mailed to a population of
16 (unclear) members.
17 Thank you.
18 MS. REILLY: Thank you, Kavita.
19 Next on the agenda is the executive
20 director's report. And the first item is
21 the matter of the next meeting, which is
22 going to be held on Thursday, March 16,
23 2023.

24 The second item is the executive
25 director's report. It's a resolution for
0005

1 Robert Bethelmy, the director of member
2 services.

3 "Whereas, Robert Bethelmy began

4 working for the Teachers' Retirement
5 System in October 1993, rising to the
6 leadership positions in the member
7 services department, became director of
8 member services in 2002;

9 "Whereas, Robert Bethelmy guided a
10 state of the art member services center
11 with established direct member contact,
12 and the department expanded to include
13 member education, public communications,
14 research and service requests support,
15 with all areas committed to higher
16 quality member services;

17 "And whereas Robert Bethelmy
18 instilled in his team a member-centric
19 approach coupling empathy and respect
20 with accuracy and responsibility, working
21 toward outcomes that are just for members
22 and for the system;

23 "And whereas Robert has long been
24 admired and respected by his fellow
25 directors and colleagues in TRS who are

1 grateful for his leadership, opportunity,
2 collaboration and friendship;

3 "And whereas Robert Bethelmy
4 developed a close working relationship
5 with external member representatives
6 including the Teacher Trustees, and they
7 have deeply appreciated the efforts of
8 Robert and his team on behalf of TRS
9 members;

10 "And whereas Robert Bethelmy is
11 well-known for his kindness, patience and
12 good humor, as well as his love of Star
13 Trek and the New York Jets;

14 (Laughter.)

15 "And whereas, Robert Bethelmy has
16 always been able to rely on the support
17 of his wife -- and the rest of his loving
18 family;

19 "And whereas Robert Bethelmy has --
20 TRS to nearly 30 years of devoted
21 service;

22 "Therefore be it resolved that the
23 Trustees of the Teachers' Retirement
24 Board thank Robert Bethelmy for his
25 contributions to TRS and its members;

1 "And be it further resolved that the
2 Trustees wish Robert a happy, healthy and
3 fulfilling time -- "

4 MR. BETHELMY: I'm humbled -- thank
5 you. It's been a privilege working here

6 for almost the last 30 years. Thank you
7 so much, working alongside wonderful
8 colleagues here, Patricia, Pat, all my
9 fellow directors. And I'm especially
10 grateful for working alongside my member
11 services team. Nothing, I couldn't have
12 accomplished anything without their
13 support. I thank them, each one of them.

14 And I know they will continue to do
15 great things, because that's what we're
16 about here, to serve the members and
17 continue to provide the quality services
18 that they deserve.

19 So thank you again, Patricia.

20 MS. REILLY: Thank you.

21 CHAIRPERSON BROWN: Do I hear a

15 MS. REILLY: Not anymore.

16 CHAIRPERSON BROWN: On a personal
17 note, you have been a friend to us, all
18 our Trustees; your kindness, your
19 dedication. I know how much you love
20 your family, love Joan. And we love you
21 and we wish you the best of everything in
22 time. And a long retirement, good health
23 and miles in your mileage program.

24 (Laughter.)

25 Travel -- see the world, well

1 deserved, thirty years.

2 Any other --

3 MR. KAZANSKY: I'll chime in.

4 When you have someone whose job it
5 is to be the base voice of an
6 organization and how it interfaces with
7 the members, you want someone with

8 kindness, you want someone with
9 compassion. And we get that in droves
10 with you, Robert.
11 I've never, ever for a minute
12 doubted you when you've ever said we're
13 going to fix that problem or solve this
14 issue or call that member.
15 Every member that we've ever brought
16 you, from the Trustees that sit before
17 you today to our predecessors, there's
18 never been a moment where we ever doubted
19 that you would do anything and everything
20 in your power to help solve member
21 problems. We appreciate that.
22 On a personal level, it is a gift,
23 it was a gift to work with you. It's
24 nice to work with somebody you like and
25 respect, that you get along with and is a

2 movies or sci fi --
3 (Talking over each other.)
4 As your ship leaves -- and may you
5 live long and prosper.
