MS. REILLY: So there is an update on TRS operations. Each of you received the calendar events, and we have a few updates from Ellen DeLeo.

MS. DeLEO: I just have one update. As we begin the summer retirement season, benefits administration is preparing for summer retirements. To date, approximately a thousand members were scheduled for pension consultations between April 1st and June 30th. As of May 15th, the total of 314 retirement applications have been received by TRS with retirement dates in June, July, and August of 2015.

MS. REILLY: Thanks, Ellen.

And the next item on the agenda is the executive director's report. The first item there is the next meeting. And it's been

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suggested that the next meeting be the third Thursday of the month, June 18, 2015. So if you can mark that on your calendars.
