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1	MS. REILLY: Good afternoon. We are
2	going to begin the June 18th regular meeting
3	of the Teachers' Retirement Board. I will
4	start by calling the roll.
5	John Adler?
6	MR. ADLER: Here.
7	MS. REILLY: Thomas Brown?
8	MR. BROWN: Here.
9	MS. REILLY: David Kazansky?
10	MR. KAZANSKY: Here.
11	MS. REILLY: Sandra March?
12	MS. MARCH: Present.
13	MS. REILLY: Raymond Orlando?
14	MS. LAPADULA: Tisa standing in for
15	Raymond.
16	MS. REILLY: And Susannah Vickers?
17	MS. VICKERS: Here.
18	MS. REILLY: Thank you. We do have a
19	quorum, and we can go on to the next item
20	which is an update on TRS operations. Each of
21	you received the latest calendar of events,
22	and we have a few updates from Ellen DeLeo,
23	the director of our business solutions group.
24	MS. DeLEO: I just have three quick
25	updates.

Τ	TRS is in the process of reviewing
2	retiree benefits in response to the UFT
3	contract implementation. TRS performed the
4	work necessary to revise 4,674 Tier III and IV
5	retiree benefits in response to the UFT
6	contract. An additional 784 Tier I and Tier
7	II members have also been reviewed. Revisions
8	reviewed to date represent 39 percent of the
9	overall population of approximately 14,000
10	members who retired between November 1, 2009
11	and June 30, 2014. That will be revised as
12	per the UFT contract.

TRS has received a total of 991 summer retirement applications that are being processed by benefits administration. 176 retirement applications were received for the effective date of 6/30/2015. Of those applications, 159 are CSA members. An additional 815 retirement applications were submitted with July effective dates of which six are CSA members.

TRS contacted our new Tier VI members to promote our TDA program using an e-mail campaign. 5,295 members were contacted during the spring and encouraged to enroll in our TDA

1	program. Of the members contacted, 1,079
2	enrolled, representing a greater than 20
3	percent response rate.
4	MS. REILLY: Thank you, Ellen.
5	The next item on the agenda is the
6	executive director's report and the first item
7	in there is the next meeting, and it's been
8	suggested that the next regular board meeting
9	of the Teachers' Retirement System be held on
10	September 17, 2015. So mark your calendars.

16	"On March 26, 2015, the Teachers'
17	Retirement Board authorized the Comptroller to
18	invest certain funds of the Teachers'
19	Retirement System for a period of three
20	months. In the event that the Board desires
21	to continue this authorization, the following
22	resolution is submitted for consideration and
23	approval: 'Resolved'"
24	MS. MARCH: Waive the reading.
25	MR. ADLER: So do we have a motion to

1	approve the resolution to authorize the
2	Comptroller of the City of New York to invest
3	certain funds? Is there a motion?

23	Fiscal Year 2013, Fiscal Year 2014, and Fiscal
24	Year 2015; and be it further resolved, that
25	the Trustees of the Teachers' Retirement Board

1	hereby approve a modification of the Fiscal
2	Year 2016 budget by increasing such budget in
3	the amount of 117,000 to cover contractual
4	increases for Fiscal Year 2016.
5	MR. ADLER: Is there a motion to approve
6	the resolution regarding union contract
7	increases for TRS employees?

20	from the Passport Fund Program. Page 167 is
21	the successive installment payments. Page 168
22	are lump sum payments. Page 169 through 176

are outstanding checks. Page 177 to 2,527,

inclusive, are revisions, including those

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1	Page 2,528 through 2,529, inclusive, are

1	MS. MARCH: I would just like to point
2	out, if I might, because I don't think this
3	was done during Ellen's report, for those
4	trustees who are new and for our actuary who
5	is new, you will find there are two
6	newsletters here that go out to the inservice
7	members as an inservice news.
8	And we don't call retirees "inactive".
9	We call them "retirees", and I think the most
10	interesting thing in this report is the fact
11	of how many of our retirees remain in the
12	State of New York and in the City of New York,
13	adding to the economy and the growth of our
14	city and state because it is here that they
15	are spending their hard-earned defined benefit
16	pension, and I think that's extremely
17	important to our economy.
18	So for those of you who have not seen
19	this newsletter before, we just wanted you to
20	have it, and we thank Patricia for Matt
21	Laskowski who is our communications person who
22	helped put this publication together, and of
23	course, all the members of the Retirement
24	System who work so hard.

And then one other point: This is our

T	last meeting of the season, so on behalf of
2	all the trustees, if I may talk for them, we
3	thank Patricia and Thad and the directors for
4	working so hard to keep our members informed
5	and present them with their benefits, and we
6	especially thank you for the rapidity of
7	recalculating the pensions for those people
8	who lived without a salary during the previous
9	mayor's administration. Thank you.
10	MS. REILLY: Thank you.
11	MS. MARCH: Have a good summer.
12	MR. ADLER: Any other business?
13	MS. REILLY: Next item on the agenda are
14	there any questions or comments from the
15	public. We do have a question from the
16	public.
17	MR. ADLER: Would you just identify
18	yourself for the record?
19	MR. GELFAND: Andrew Gelfand, member,
20	retiree, beneficiary, whatever you want to
21	call it.
22	About a year ago I raised an issue of a
23	member ombudsman. I was wondering if any
24	action was taken on that.
25	MR. ADLER: A member ombudsman.

1	MS. MARCH: We have one. He is sitting
2	right over there. I don't think we can have a
3	better ombudsman than our former chair of this
4	Retirement Board. Maybe we will consider
5	that.
6	MR. GELFAND: The problem is he does not
7	have access to records, materials, and so on
8	that he that an employee of the Retirement
9	System would have. There is a big difference
10	between an ombudsman who is a fellow retiree
11	and somebody who is working for the Teachers'
12	Retirement System and has rights.
13	MS. REILLY: We have Robert Bethelmy who
14	is our member services director who does act
15	as the representative of our members at TRS.
16	MR. GELFAND: Once again, there should
17	be somebody who is not involved with the
18	services directly but be a spokesman and
19	somebody who is an intermediary when there is
20	a problem.
21	Then there is a second issue. And that
22	is the question of whether or not the
23	Teachers' Retirement System is in compliance
24	with FOIL Law, Freedom Of Information Law and
25	the Open Meetings Law. Okav. FOILs are sent

1	in and ignored. FOILs are postponed. The
2	minutes for the May meeting were not responded
3	to. They were not put up on the website.
4	They do not have to be approved. They are
5	supposed to be available within ten days of
6	the meeting. They were not made available.
7	MS. REILLY: They are available now on
8	the website.
9	MS. BUDZIK: TRS is very diligent in
LO	responding to FOIL requests. I know we do get
L1	regular requests for the Board minutes, and
L2	those minutes are posted on our website in
L3	addition to a summary of the meetings as soon
L4	as possible once we receive them from the
L5	stenographer. And I guess I can't count the
L6	days, but they are up there very quickly.
L7	MR. GELFAND: The May meeting, I was
L8	just informed they were posted this morning.
L9	They were questioned earlier in the month.
20	There was no acknowledgment of that e-mail.
21	MS. BUDZIK: And I think we have
22	acknowledged we get an e-mail every month
23	from you asking for the meetings, and I think
24	every month is the meetings are posted on the

website when we get them. So that's really a

1	standing response. But the meetings are
2	posted on the website.
3	MR. GELFAND: But the law requires them
4	to be available within a certain amount of
5	time, and the Open Meetings Law requires that
6	the meetings be announced. Now, the meeting
7	is announced on the website. It's going to be
8	held. It's not when or where. It simply says
9	there was a meeting scheduled for today.
10	MS. BUDZIK: And again, I am not sure
11	that's accurate. The calendar of meetings is
12	posted on TRS's website, and I just have to
13	take exception
14	MR. GELFAND: Well, everyone has their
15	iPhones in front of them. If you look at it
16	and I just happened to check it on the way
17	in today to make sure I was appearing at the
18	right time. It was not posted time or place.
19	MS. BUDZUK: They are every month at the
20	same time in the same place. The thing that
21	varies is
22	MR. GELFAND: They are supposed to be
23	posted time and place. And the other thing is
24	if you read your bylaws, we are in the wrong
25	place. The bylaws call for this meetings to

1	to be held on Worth Street. How many years
2	have we been in this building? They have
3	never been updated.
4	MS. BUDZIK: That is actually we do
5	have to update the address for the meetings.
6	MR. GELFAND: These are points, and to
7	quote some of your colleagues, they may be
8	technical items, but technical items are what
9	lawyers make their living on. And I think
10	this is something that should be looked into
11	and corrected. The minutes should be
12	available within the time stipulated by the
13	law, and the meeting notices should have the
14	information that's required. They are
15	actually supposed to be posted someplace. A
16	physical posting someplace.
17	MS. BUDZIK: So we are looking now at
18	the website, and it does indicate the time and
19	location for the meeting.
20	MR. GELFAND: Not on the
21	MR. KAZANSKY: In the first paragraph
22	above the dates, it says they are held on the
23	16th
24	MR. GELFAND: general news page.

MS. BUDZIK: So your question is you

1	don't like where they appear on the website.
2	Our point is it is posted. "The Teachers'
3	Retirement Board generally meets monthly"
4	MR. GELFAND: That's not a posting of
5	the meeting.
6	MS. BUDZIK: Let me finish.
7	"Except for during July and August.
8	Meetings take place in the boardroom on the
9	16th floor of our 55 Water Street headquarters
10	in Lower Manhattan. Board meetings are open
11	to the public. They are usually held the
12	third Thursday of the month at 3:30".
13	But then if you go down, the actual
14	dates of all the meetings are posted.
15	MR. GELFAND: They are posted on the
16	main opening page of the TRS does not have the
17	time or the place. You have to go in further.
18	Whether or not that calendar is an official
19	posting is a question for Robert Friedman up
20	in Albany and whether it's open government.
21	MS. BUDZIK: Again, what I am hearing is
22	you don't like where it's posted on our
23	website, but it is posted on the website.
24	MR. GELFAND: Posting the meeting
25	should be posted as every meeting is supposed

1	to be posted. Not in a long list because that
2	calendar is subject to adjustment.
3	Technicalities are technicalities.
4	MS. REILLY: Thank you.
5	MR. ADLER: Any other comments or
6	questions from the public? Okay. Hearing
7	none, then I think a motion is in order to go
8	into attorney-client.
9	MS. BUDZIK: We would adjourn the
10	meeting and then have a short attorney-client
11	update.
12	MR. ADLER: A motion would be in order
13	to adjourn the meeting.
14	Is there a motion to adjourn?
15	MS. MARCH: So moved.
16	MR. ADLER: Is there a second?
